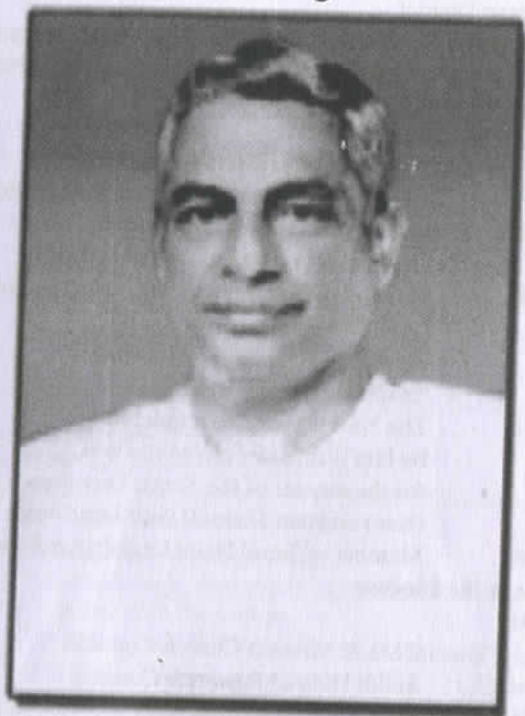

Born on 12-06-1895 at Nesapuram, Vilavancode Taluk, Kanyakumari District.

Graduated at The Maharaja's College, Thiruvananthapuram and studied Law at the Law College, Thiruvananthapuram. Started his Legal Profession in 1921.

His Role in Public Life :

- 1943-1947 : Chairman of Nagercoil Municipality
1945-1947 : Member Travancore Legislative Assembly
1948-1952 : Member of Travancore - Cochin
Legislative Assembly
1952-1957 : Member of Parliament, Nagercoil Constituency
(1962-1968 also)
1955 : Elected as President of Travancore,
Tamil Nadu Congress Party
1956 : The Yeoman service rendered
by him ultimately paved the way
for the merger of the South Travancore
(Kanyakumari District) with Tamil Nadu.
1957-1962 : Member of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly

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1. BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Foundation

In the year 1868, **Rev. James Emlyn** from New Castle, U.K., an LMS missionary bought the land where the college is located now. **Rev. Robert Sinclair**, who succeeded **Rev. James Emlyn** in the year 1910, built a bungalow and started a Boarding School on the campus measuring 32 acres.

After independence the long felt need for a college at Marthandam resulted in the starting of the Christian College in June 1964 by the Kanyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India. The Executive Committee of the Diocese, which met on 04-01-1964, entrusted the responsibility of raising funds for the buildings needed to an adhoc committee consisting of Messrs. **N. Dennis**, Ex. MP(Convener) **G.A. Ambrose**, **J. Nesamony**, **P.S. Wilson** and **Rev. M.Amose**. The Diocese set apart sufficient extent of wet lands as endowment to satisfy the University requirement. The public, in and around Marthandam, the parents, students and members of the teaching and non-teaching staff took keen interest in the growth of the college and contributed substantially at different stages for its development.

With the permission of the **Madras University** the Pre-University course was started in 1964 with 171 students. The college was inaugurated on **the 6th of Aug. 1964** by the then Bishop **Rt. Rev. I.R.H. Gnanadason**, with **Dr. John D.K. Sundar Singh** as the first Principal.

In June 1965, the College introduced undergraduate courses with **Mathematics, History** and **Economics** as major subjects. From the year 1966, the college was an affiliated institution of the **Madurai University** which was later renamed as Madurai Kamaraj University. The College became a Post Graduate Institution in the year 1980-81 with the introduction M.Sc. in Physics. A **Ph.D. Research** centre in **History** was started in the year 1997 in the regular scheme. The College now offers 17 U.G., 14 P.G, 11 M.Phil., a PG Diploma & 5 Ph.D. courses. The present student strength is 3563. At present 171 teaching, one chaplain and 103 non-teaching staff members are working in this college.

In the year 1991, the College became a constituent college of the newly formed **Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli**. In the marvellous growth of the college, God has guided and blessed us immensely. With faith in divine guidance and co-operation from the public, it is hoped that the College will grow further into a fruitful centre of learning.

The College is an accredited institution with **A Grade** awarded by the NAAC for the period 2014-2019.

In June 1984, the College was re-named as **Nesamony Memorial Christian College** in recognition of the yeoman services rendered by the late Thiru.A. **Nesamony** M.A.,B.L. to the Kanyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India.

The Emblem

The emblem of our College bears a Cross, a Church, a Palmyrah tree, a Star, a book and a Lotus flower.

The cross shows that our college is a Christian Institution. The Church signifies sanctification, as we get sanctified through prayer. The Palmyrah tree is a special feature of the district. Every part of it is useful in our daily life. At the top there is a Star which stands for guidance. We look up to Him whenever we are in need of guidance. The open Book and the Lotus, our National flower, symbolise knowledge and wisdom respectively, which we impart to our dear students on the campus. Our motto - **FAITH, ENDEAVOUR, POWER** - embraces all these features.

The main objective of this college is to provide higher education to socially and economically backward people in and around Marthandam. For the last 48 years, this Institution has been striving hard to achieve this goal. A number of innovative programmes and projects are being carried out in this college to lift the downtrodden people of this area. We hope that in the near future N.M. Christian College, Marthandam, will accomplish its basic goal.

2. ADMINISTRATION

The Nesamony Memorial Christian College is owned and managed by the Kanyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India. The Executive Committee of the Diocese appoints the Principal of the College. The College Governing Board, constituted by the Diocese, makes all other appointments subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. The major financial and administrative policies of the College are formulated by the Governing Board. The general administration of the College is vested in the Principal. He is assisted by the Vice-Principal in the day-to-day administration of the College. In the absence of the Principal, the Vice-Principal or the authorized Professor in station shall be in charge of the routine affairs of the College. The Principal shall be responsible for supervising the maintenance of the accounts and properties of the College in accordance with the rules stipulated by the University, the Government and the Management.

The Heads of Departments will be responsible to the Principal for the organization, co-ordination and smooth running of their departments.

THE STAFF COUNCIL

5. FEES, CONCESSIONS & SCHOLARSHIPS

TUITION FEES

Every student has to pay the whole fees prescribed for each semester during any part of which his/her name is on the rolls and his attendance registered whether such fees be paid in one or two instalments.

The first instalment of fees for the academic year will be collected before reopening or at the time of admission, the special fees will not be refunded if the student fails to join the College or leaves after joining. The second instalment will be collected in November. There is no Tuition Fee for both UG and PG Students of aided courses.

The Schedule for repayment of fees will be notified.

According to the Tamil Nadu Education Rule 90(a) "if a student fails to pay his/her fee on the day fixed for payment, a fine at the rate of 1 Re. per day has to be collected from the date of implementing the fine. If a student fails to remit his / her fees with fine within 10 working days his/her name has to be removed from the rolls. Absence from College with or without leave applications offers no ground for exemption. If readmitted, he/ she must pay in addition to the fees and fine due from him/her a readmission fee of Rs.5. Holders of fee concession and of scholarships of any kind are also bound by all the above regulations.

CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The Management and the Governments, both the state and the Central, have come forward to help students in their study in various forms. Eligibility conditions for availing scholarship will be announced as and when needed through notices to the students. Scholarship forms will be issued to students at the College office in time. These scholarships and concessions should be applied for only after the students pay the first semester fees in full and enroll in the college. All those who avail scholarships and fee concession must secure 75% of the attendance in all the semesters

SCHOLARSHIPS

- i) **Adhi Dravida Scholarship** for the Hindu Scheduled Caste Scheduled Tribe students. Income limit is Rs. 100000/- per annum.
- ii) **Govt. of India Scholarship for the Physically Handicapped and the Blind.** Income limit is Rs. 50000/- per annum.
- iii) **National Scholarship for meritorious Students**
- iv) **Scholarship for first generation graduates ;**

This Scholarship is given to students who come from families where there are no graduates and whose parental income does not exceed Rs. 50000/- per annum. This is given to students of U.G. courses till the completion of the course. If they break their studies they should refund the whole amount they received from the Government.

v) **Nagammayar fee concession :**

This fee concession is awarded to all P.G. girl students belonging to backward classes and girls of Nair community whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs. 24000/- . They should continue their studies till the completion of the course lest they should refund the concession amount to the Govt. Income certificate obtained from the Tahsildar should be submitted every year to the college.

- vi) **Dependants of Ex. Servicemen** can apply through the D.S.S.A. Board.
- vii) The incentive for **Tamil Medium** degree Students will be Rs. 400/- as per the Government rules.

OTHER STATE GOVT. SCHOLARSHIPS

- i) Department of Adhi Dravida Welfare awards scholarships to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe students including converts

whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs.100000 These students should not avail of Govt. of India Post Merit Scholarship.

- ii) State Govt. Scholarship for **Physically handicapped and the blind.**
- iii) Department of **Backward Classes** awards scholarships to all **B.C.** and **M.B.C.** students including Hindu Nadars, Christian Nadars and Ezhavas. Income Limits is Rs. 50000/- per annum. Students of M.B.C. have no income limit.
- iv) **Fee concession is available for the wards of farmers having identity card.**

Eligible students get the forms from the college office. **Filled in application forms accompanied by attested copies of Income and Community certificates signed by the Tahsildar, should be submitted before the 25th of July.**

The Community Certificate should agree with the Community mentioned in the S.S.L.C. Book. Incomplete application forms will be rejected.

OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Scholarship for Children of Church Workers.
2. Scholarship for Children of Non-Teaching Staff.
3. Govt. of India Scholarship for minority students.

The amount of Scholarships for the first two is determined on the basis of the available funds and the number of beneficiaries. The third one is given to Christian / Muslim students.

STUDENT AID FUND

The student aid fund is generated from the student aid fee of Rs. 2/- collected from each student. This will be available in the

form of cash for poor deserving students to meet examination fee, a small part of tuition fee, cost of specific books essential for their study, clothing or medical expenses.

Meritorious but poor students who wish to avail of this fund, can apply to the Principal through their HoD. Based on the recommendations of the HoD and the advice of the advisory body consisting of students and staff representatives the Principal will administer the fund. In addition to the financial status and academic performance, the conduct and character of the beneficiary will also be an important determining factor in the selection of students who benefit from the above fund.

The interest of the endowment amount of Rs. 4000/- instituted by Prof. A.J. Harris is available for the purpose of extending aid for the deserving students.

FREE MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

With the monthly contribution by the staff and the donations from the students and well wishers, the College provides free mid-day meals on working days to a limited number of poor students. More students could benefit if the fund is increased.

The interest of the endowment funds like Rev. Harris Memorial endowment (Rs. 1000/-) Miss. Isaacs Endowment (Rs. 1000/-) and the endowment (Rs. 7,000/-) instituted by the College Students Council of 1978-79 are also available for the above purpose.

Other Student Support Schemes :

- * Endowment prize for meritorious Students.
- * Merit Scholarship for poor & rank holders sponsored by Alumni Association
- * Management Scholarship for poor Students
- * Financial help for attending seminar, paper presentation etc.

6. CAMPUS FACILITIES AND STUDENTS' AMENITIES

a) Library and Book Bank

The Library Block is named after Rev. James Emlyn, an LMS Missionary from U.K. who purchased the lands where Nesamony Memorial Christian College has been built. The library is a fairly large with a collection of about 55404 volumes in all disciplines. The library regularly subscribes to 11 dailies, and more than 65 standard journals in almost all subjects besides general periodicals in Tamil, English and Malayalam. The general reading room can accommodate nearly 100 readers at a time. Separate reference section is maintained for the benefit of the Post Graduate students and researchers. Library is fully automated. Open access is given to all students. The Library is kept open on all working days from 9.15 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. During vacation the library is kept open on all Wednesdays.

U.G. Students who belong to the socially and educationally backward classes can avail book bank facilities. They can borrow books from the library for a whole semester which they need to return only after the semester examinations.

Every student in the college is eligible for membership in the library. On production of the Identity Card at the Library counter, books will be issued to the students. The books borrowed from the library should be returned within fifteen calendar days, failing which an overdue charge of 25 paise per day will be collected. If the book is not on demand, it will be renewed for another fifteen days. For renewal, the book should be presented at the counter.

Books are to be handled very carefully. If any book is damaged it should either be replaced or its cost be paid with an additional 50% of the cost along with overdue charges.

Reference books and periodicals are available only for reference in the Library. Strict silence should be maintained in the library and reading room.

(b) Students' Book Store

The purpose of the Students Books Store is to get books and note books to the students in time. The cost of books not issued to students will be refunded at the end of the year. Students are asked to check up the individual account cards maintained in the Book Store before closing the accounts for the year. Accounts of students who leave the College during the year will be settled immediately before getting the Transfer Certificate. Students are instructed to note down the cost of books they receive for future reference.

(c) Red Ribbon Club :

This committee is constituted as per the guidelines issued by the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli. The motto of this club is:

- To help AIDS Patients
- To Create awareness among the public and students regarding AIDS.
- To encourage blood donation and create awareness among the donors regarding hygiene.

(d) Personality Development :

- Grievance Redressal
- Moral Instruction

It aims at helping students adjust themselves to the demands of college life, and acquaint themselves with the various resources available in the college and through the college. It helps students develop life goals that will be challenging to their innate talents, capabilities and aptitude.

(e) Human Resource Development (HRD)

A Remedial Coaching Committee has started functioning in the college from last academic year. One of the major objectives of this committee is to conduct U.G.C./C.S.I.R. Coaching classes for those appearing for research fellowship examinations after completion of their post graduate studies. The Committee is entrusted with providing model questions to each department and to provide sufficient reference materials for paper II. The committee is also conducting coaching classes for civil service examinations. Since many of our students are weak in part II English, the committee will make arrangements to conduct remedial coaching in Part II English for the final year UG students.

(f) Career Guidance and Placement cell :

One of the important Committees, constituted recently on our campus, is Career Guidance & Placement Cell. Dedicated staff members of the college are in this committee. Its major objectives are ;

- To invite companies for placement
- To provide available information on the jobs/positions, opportunities, etc.
- To provide necessary literature/brochure/information/entrepreneurship.
- To conduct Seminars/Workshops.

- To develop the aptitude of students towards preference of jobs.
- To generate resources for the needy students to apply for jobs/starting enterprises.

(g) Road Safety Patrol (RSP)

Under the National Service Scheme of N.M.C. College, Marthandam (No. 82, 83, 135, 139, 188 and 189) a Road Safety Patrol started functioning in the college for the last eight years with the guidance of Mr. Judson, Co-ordinator, Road Patrol for Kanyakumari and Nellai Districts. About 42 student volunteers of N.S.S. are members of this patrol. They are helping in maintaining traffic regulations in and around Marthandam. The inauguration of this programme was conducted on 09-03-2002 at Marthandam Junction.

(h) Anti-Eve Teasing & Counselling Committee

As per the instruction of the Govt. of Tamil Nadu an Anti-Eve Teasing Cell started functioning in our College from the academic year 2001-2002. Any eve teasing incident shall be brought to the notice of this committee. It also helps the students in overcoming academic, social, personal and emotional problems.

The major activities of this cell include the conduct of periodic seminars on anti-eve teasing and competitions on the theme 'anti-eve teasing'. The cell also gives counselling to students on the problems related to anti-eve teasing.

(i) Complaints Committee :

As per the direction of the Supreme Court, this committee is constituted to contain ragging. If ragging occurred in the campus, it has to be reported to this committee for necessary action.

(j) Alumni Association :

All the students who have studied in Nesamony Memorial Christian College are encouraged to become members

of the association and to involve actively in the programmes conducted by the association.

(k) Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

Parent Teacher Association was started on 21-04-1994. The general body meeting of the association is convened once in a year. The Executive Committee meets at least six times a year. The association plays a vital role in providing infrastructure for the college. It also involves in the overall development of the students.

(l) Students' Christian Movement :

The Students' Christian Movement (SCM) provides Christian values to the Protestant Christian students of the College. The Principal is the Patron of this movement who is guided by the Chaplain. It has two Staff Advisors, a secretary and student representatives from each class. The activities are :

1. Morning worship during working days
2. Special meetings on every Tuesday.
3. Hospital visits.
4. Contribution to Blind School Students, Cancer Patients and AIDS Victims
5. Carol rounds during Christmas.

(m) Christian Education Council Diploma Class

The Christian Education Council Diploma class was initiated in our college in 1991. The syllabus for the first year students is New Testament, second year - Old Testament and third year - Christian Faith. The Classes are conducted every Wednesday evening. The annual examination is conducted in March.

(n) Career Oriented Programmes (COP) Ph: 04651-270229

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has sanctioned the following job oriented Certificate, / Diploma and Advanced Diploma courses for the Degree students from the academic year 2005-2006. Classes will be held during evening hours. Students of UG Classes are eligible for studying the COP Courses

Language Lab :

The Language Laboratory started functioning from 2008. This computer aided lab helps the students to develop their communication skill. Training will be given to all the students in a phased manner.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL - 9443429561

A women's Hostel, partially Sponsored by University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, started functioning in the Campus from the academic year 2009 - 2010 onwards. Any girl student of this college is eligible to join the hostel. The hostel is well furnished with triple seater rooms. A mess is run by the hostel authorities on dividing system. An establishment fee of Rs.3000/- per semester is collected from each inmate. The hostel committee administers the womens hostel.

7. RULES & REGULATIONS

(a) General Discipline

1. Every student has an obligation to obey the rules and regulations of the college and to respect and uphold its discipline.

Students should dress neatly and decently.

Boys are allowed to wear only shirts and pants.

The shirt should be neatly tucked in.

Boys should not wear short shirts/ Multicoloured shirts with pictures/ Pants with Multiple pockets/ Jeans pants/T-shirts/Dhothies*.

Girls should dress modestly and should not wear transparent dresses/half sarees.

2. The behaviour of the students should be gentlemanly. Indecent behaviour towards teachers or fellow students or others will be dealt with seriously.
3. The students should move quietly from one classroom to another and maintain discipline.
4. Students should be in their classes in time, and shall sit according to their class number.
5. No student shall leave the classroom or laboratory without the permission of the teacher-in-charge.
6. Late comers shall enter the classroom or laboratory only with the permission of the teacher-in-charge.
7. The cleanliness and safety of the College building and its property is the responsibility of every student. Any attempt to damage the college property would be viewed very seriously

8. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending meetings in the College, distributing notices or hand bills or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
9. Student shall not address to any authority in a collective petition or make complaints to a body. All requests, petitions, complaints and appeals should be made to the Principal.
10. Every student must wear the Identity Card in the college premises.
11. Smoking and use of alcohol or intoxicating drinks or drugs are strictly prohibited.
12. The college authorities will not be responsible for misconduct or criminal offence outside the college. Students are expected to behave in a fitting manner even outside the college so as to keep up the good name of the Alma mater.
13. The boys should not enter the premises of the girls' retiring room under any circumstance.
14. Any student
 - i) Who is persistently insubordinate
 - ii) Who is habitually irregular in attendance or inattentive to his work in class.
 - iii) Who is repeatedly or willfully mischievous or obscene in word or act.
 - iv) Who is guilty of fraud or malpractice in examinations,

- v) Who takes part in political agitations or in any movement causing social discord, will be removed from the rolls temporarily or permanently according to the severity of the offence.
- vi) Students are not permitted to bring cellphones into the campus. Violation of this rule will be viewed seriously.
- vii) If any student indulges in eve-teasing and ragging, criminal action will be initiated against that student.

(b) Issue of certificates

1. Transfer Certificates will be issued to students who leave the Institution, only after all the dues are paid.
2. Certificate (Transfer, conduct etc.) will be issued within a week from the date of application.
3. The principal will not issue a certificate of pass for any university examination.
4. Fees for the issue of certificates :

a) Issue of Transfer Certificates	Rs. 30
b) Duplicate Transfer Certificate	Rs. 500
c) Any information /certificates from the college records	Rs. 10

(c) Attendance & Leave

1. University and College rules require regular attendance in all classes/ (theory and practical), Games, NCC., NSS., and other part V subjects.
2. Leave should be applied for, in advance in the form available at the department. Leave application should be addressed to the Vice-Principal through HoD.
3. Absence without the leave application is punishable with fine.
4. Attendance is taken at the beginning of each period. Absence in one class either in the morning or evening will amount to absence for half a day.

5. In case of unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, the leave applications shall be submitted immediately on return after absence.
6. A student absenting himself from the College for more than 15 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to be removed from the rolls.
7. Leave applications, in the case of illness should be countersigned by the parents or guardian. Application for sick leave for more than three days should be accompanied by medical certificate.
8. No student will be exempted from Tests or Assignments.
9. Fee concession holders and scholarship holders should have minimum 90% attendance (G.O. 666 of 24.4.1979)
10. Students have to put in 75% attendance for writing university examination without paying condonation fee to the University. Rs. 300/- will be charged from those who have 60% to 75% attendance, and if less than 60% the semester has to be repeated.

8. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Students' Council Constitution :

ARTICLE-I : Aim

- A. The aim of the Council is to help students engage themselves in meaningful pursuits outside the co-curricular programme of the College and to provide opportunities for training as good citizens.
- B. The Council will try to achieve these aims mainly through debates, lectures, meetings and cultural programmes.

ARTICLE II : Membership

All students of the college shall be deemed to be members of the Council, for the academic year and all members of the staff shall be its honorary members.

ARTICLE III : Office Bearers of the Executive committee

- A. The Principal is the President of the Council, and he may appoint three members of the staff to the Executive Committee of the Council, out of which one will be the Treasurer and two will be Advisors.
- B. There shall be an elected Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Joint-Secretary for the Council.
- C. The Chairman may preside over ordinary meetings of the Council. The Principal or the Vice-Principal shall preside over business and special meetings of the Council and also the meetings of the Executive Committee
- D. The secretary shall arrange the meetings of the Council in consultation with the President and Chairman and shall

conduct other matters of the Council according to the decision of the President and the Executive Committee of the Council.

The composition of Executive Committee:

1. The Principal
2. The Vice-Principal
3. Three staff members nominated by the Principal (2 Advisors and 1 Treasurer)
4. The Chairman (Students' Council)
5. The Vice-Chairman (Students' Council)
6. The Secretary (Students' Council)
7. The joint-Secretary (Students' Council)
8. Six other elected members (Students' Council)
9. Two other students to be co-opted by the Committee on nomination by the Principal to secure fair representation.

ARTICLE IV : Election :

Mode of Election

As per the Manomaniam Sundaranar University Guidelines (Vide No. MSU/A/CO.UN.EL/2007-08), the college adopts indirect election in electing the office - bearers and the executive members of the students union council. Under indirect election method, each class, I, II and III years of undergraduate courses, I and II years post graduate programmes and M.Phil, will elect a representative each and all these class representative will form the electoral college to elect the office - bearers and members to Executive directly.

The apex body under the proposed dispensation will be "University students Union", to which the electoral college will be the student's representative chosen from affiliated colleges and University departments (Chairman and Secretary). For the

university students union, four office bearers as in colleges, and two student representatives from each district, Tirunelveli, Tuticorin and Kanyakumari (3 x 2 = 6), for the Executive committee will be elected.

Eligibility of Students to contest

* A student contesting the election should be a regular full time student have cleared all papers till the date of nomination with 75% attendance in the previous semester. The contesting candidates should not have criminal charges or affiliation to any political or communal outfit. They should not have any charges of indiscipline.

* All the students of the college shall have the right to vote and contest in the election of the Students Council. The Chairman and the Secretary candidates shall be from the third year UG classes or second year P.G. classes.

* Students elected as Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary and Executive Committee members of the Council shall not hold office in any other association in the college and shall resign other offices to which they may have been elected earlier.

* First year UG and PG students cannot become members of Executive Committee.

* The elections of the Chairman, Vice-chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary and student members of the Executive Committee will be conducted by President or by the Advisor appointed by him. Elections shall generally be by secret ballot.

* If any student is identified as guilty and fined Rs. 50/- and above, that student shall not be eligible to contest in any of the student Council elections.

Grievance cell

- * A Grievance cell constituted by the staff council will dispose of the election related disputes and complaints within 24 hours.
- * The Grievance cell will have the authority to cancel the candidature of a contestant who violates the election norms.

Code of Conduct

No election related expenditure will be permitted. Corrupt practices are totally prohibited. Wall posters, pamphlets and handbills are banned. No outsider should be allowed during the days of election process. Procession of any kind and anywhere are strictly prohibited. In the event of the violence or factional clashes, the council will cancel the whole election process and inform the decision to the University authority concerned.

Deadline for Elections

The duration of the process of election should not exceed four days in a college. The election for the University Students Union should be completed before **December 20, 2015**.

ARTICLE V : Meetings of the Executive Committee

- A. The Executive Committee of the Council shall discuss the programme of activities at least once a semester.
- B. A notice of atleast three days shall be given for meetings of the Committee by the Secretary. Urgent or special meetings may be convened on short notice on the authorization of the President.
- C. The proceedings of all the meetings of the Committee should be recorded.

D. 50 percent shall be the quorum for the Executive meeting.

E. The President has the right to convene the Executive Committee of the Council at any time.

The President shall have the power to issue directions for the proper conduct of meetings and other affairs of the Council and to revise the regulations. His interpretation of the regulations and his decisions in any dispute shall be final.

CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE ELECTED STUDENTS

(Vide proceedings of the Director of Collegiate Education No. 5763116/82 date 29-9-82.)

1. The office bearers of the Students' Council shall co-operate fully with the Principal and staff of the college in promoting intellectual and cultural activities among students.
2. The Students' Council office-bearers shall take upon themselves the responsibility of not involving in any act of indiscipline leading to disruption of normal life in the campus.
3. The problems and issues in the college shall be resolved by representations and negotiations and not be resorting to any other method.
4. The office-bearers shall under no circumstance deem it as part of their duty to represent to the authorities on matters and causes, which do not fall under the purview of the Council.
5. The office-bearers may make their representations to the Principal only on matters pertaining to the general interest of the students and not on individual cases.

6. The Council office-bearers shall not interfere directly or indirectly in matters involving discipline and action thereon, which are the responsibilities of the Principal.
7. No decision on the activities/programmes of the Council shall be taken by the Council office bearers except with the recommendations of the Students' representatives Council consisting of the office-bearers of the Department Associations and staff advisers and approval of the Principal.
8. The Budget for the Council shall be prepared by the Council Office-bearers in consultation with the Students Representatives Council and the staff advisers. This shall be submitted to the Principal for approval.
9. It shall be obligatory on the part of the Council Office-bearers to present the statement of accounts of the Union twice a semester to the Students' Representatives Council.
10. The Office-bearers shall not invite any outsider to the college for meetings and functions except with the approval and consent of the Principal.
11. The Council Office-bearers shall not involve themselves in any kind of fund-raising campaigns except with the specific approval of the Principal.
12. The above said instructions shall be followed and those who violate these shall be dealt with suitably.

13. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College provides students with a whole range of Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular activities to make their campus life interesting and meaningful and mould them into matured persons.

I. COURSE REQUIREMENT

(a) National Cadet Corps. (N.C.C.) (Company III)

The 11th battalion company of the NCC has a strength of 152 Cadets (with Head Quarters at Nagercoil). The mixed battalion (boys and girls) has been functioning for the last four years. The aims of the N.C.C. are :

- i) To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens.
- ii) To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life including the armed forces and to make them always available for the service of the nation.

The tenure of N.C.C. training is normally two years. In cases of exceptional cadets, it may be extended to one more year. The N.C.C. training consists of drill with or without arms, weapon training, map reading, bayonet-fighting, range firing with rifle and light machine gun, elementary military field tactics, study of army organization and allied subjects. Selected cadets will have the privilege of attending Annual Training Camp, Summer Training Camp, Advanced Leadership Training Camp, Republic Day Parade, Mountaineering Courses and Attachment to Army Units.

There will be 40 parades per year. Attendance is compulsory for all parades. Punctuality and good turn out and active disciplined participation is expected of all cadets.

The cadets will have the chance of appearing for B and C Certificate examinations according to the proficiency attained.

(b) National Service Scheme - N.S.S.

There are six N.S.S. units - Unit Nos. 82, 83, 135, 139, 188 and 189 under the Youth Welfare Department of the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University. The authorized strength is 100 in each unit. The aims of the N.S.S. are :

1. To work with and among people.
2. To engage in creative and constructive social action.
3. To make National Service more meaningful and purposeful and to integrate the same with curriculum.
4. To provide an opportunity to the students to have a sense of participation in nation - Building tasks.
5. To inculcate the spirit of national consciousness in the minds of the students.

(b) Extension Service - Village adoption

As a part of the extension activities of the college, we have adopted perai which comes under Pacode panchayat in Vilavancode Taluk. It is socially and economically a very backward village. The objectives in adopting these village are :

- To conduct community development programmes.
- To encourage adult education and literacy programmes.
- To conduct environmental awareness programmes
- To conduct social work camps with the help of the N.G.Os,
- To make the people aware of Govt. welfare schemes.
- To have health and hygiene awareness camps.
- To give education to the local people on numerous rights.
- To create awareness among the people about consumer problems.

(c) Enrolment :

Students of degree classes with good physique and a positive attitude and who have the liking to work with and for

the underprivileged alone will be enrolled. They must be fully aware of the objectives and the responsibilities involved. Enrolment will be completed before 1st August.

There shall be a college level N.S.S. committee under the chairmanship of the Principal with a Programme Officer as Convenor. The committee may consist of not more than 10 and shall include some senior members of staff, students and leading citizens interested in the scheme. This Advisory Committee may chalk out the programme for the year. A minute book for recording the proceedings of the advisory committee should be maintained.

The N.S.S. programme officers will give further details regarding the projects and programmes.

(d) Physical Education :

There are facilities for the following games, Foot Ball, Volley Ball, Tennis, Shuttle Cock, Ball Badminton, Cricket, Tennikoit and Throw Ball. Training is given for all athletic events. There are facilities for indoor games like Table-Tennis, Chess and Carroms. Intra-mural tournaments are conducted by the College. Inter-collegiate tournaments are organized by the University. The college teams also participate in the events conducted by other organizations locally and at the district level.

Students of all classes with aptitude and interest are always welcome to use the facilities for sports and games in the college.

Further particulars and details will be available from the concerned department from time to time.

(e) Audio Visual Education

Feature films of educational and cultural value are screened periodically. It is planned to build up a film library of educational films, film strips and slides. The College has two 17 m.m. Projectors. Epidascop film strip Projector, and overhead projectors are also available.
